1.0 Call to Order

- 4.1 Parking Proposal

The discussion focused on the revised "Proposed Parking Measures for Fall 06" handout.

Ms. Molloy reminded everyone about the CPC meeting tomorrow, June 13, and that 5 people representing the Academic Senate would be voting on the proposed Parking Measures at CPC based on the results conveyed by the vote at today's Senate meeting.

Ms. Molloy extended her thanks on behalf of the Academic Senate to Business Services EVP, Joe Sullivan and Director of Security, Erik Fricke for being available at this meeting to respond to any questions/concerns/recommendations that the Division Senators may have.

After a lengthy discussion, during which everyone was given an opportunity to present his/her views/concerns/objections/recommendations about the serious safety issues posed by the current parking/traffic situation, the following motions

were made. The results of the vote and a brief rationale for each motion are presented as follows.

M/S/C To approve the Proposed Parking Measures for Fall 06 as presented in the handout with the exception and stipulations designated by the following votes (O'Connor/Schultz) Unanimous

M/S/C To have the lower level of the west campus parking lot (5) be designated faculty only 24/7 for one year (O'Connor/Haslund) Unanimous

Designate the lower staff lot in the parking structure on West Campus as a staff lot 24 hrs. a day. Evaluate the parking situation in the first year to ensure full utilization of parking spaces. (Rationale: No matter what time restriction is placed for student parking, students will take these spots before the designated time and faculty, particularly adjunct faculty, will not be able to find parking for night classes. If this lot is 24 hr. staff, students will look at upper lots first where spaces are available in the evenings.)

M/S/C To eliminate proposed meters for east campus Lot 1B and to designate these parking spaces 20 minute staff parking (and prearranged visitor), retaining handicapped parking (O'Connor/Schultz) 11 yes 1 abstention (with the abstention implying a vote for the majority – as stated by the abstainer)

Do not put meters in Lot 1B; instead label these spaces 20 minute staff parking until 5:30 pm and allow prearranged visitors to park there as well. (Rationale: Faculty, administrators, and classified staff all have legitimate needs for short term parking by the Administration Building and would not need to stop at the kiosk for a 20 minute pass; students would have no need to stop at the kiosk to seek a visitor pass and could either go directly to lot 1A for metered parking or to the West Campus to purchase short term parking passes.)

M/S/C To strongly recommend evaluation and implementation of an electronic traffic arm and passkeys at the earliest possible time (Broderick/Garey) Unanimous

Evaluate and implement the installation of an electronic arm and pass keys at the earliest date possible. Location: After the East Campus kiosk, where the Administration Building begins. (Rationale: This technology seems most promising and could help solve the larger problem of students who choose to park illegally.)
